Master's Essay/Thesis Proposal

While we expect variations in internal design of the final paper, all manuscripts must address an issue of public health significance. The proposal must address the following elements:

- 1. The purpose of the study or research, description of the agency or environment of data collection (if relevant), public health significance, and scope or focus of the study or research, including, when appropriate, the hypothesis to be tested;
- 2. Background; an introduction to the literature on the topic and where relevant, theoretical foundation;
- 3. Methods: how information will be collected and analyzed, and limitations or problems;
- 4. Implications of the findings; why this topic is important;
- 5. Potential uses for the findings.

ALSO include scheduling/timeline of tasks/anticipated graduate date (as agreed to by the student and readers/committee). Please work with your advisor to complete the following timeline. Experience has taught us that students are much more likely to graduate on time if they adhere to the agreed upon timeline.
